On 23 February 2008, 25 Warwickers and friends got together at Novotel Century Hong Kong to attend an intriguing talk conducted by Marco Szeto, a fellow Warwick graduate who is now the Curator of Xubaizhai (虛白齋), Hong Kong Museum of Art. Macro shared with us the "inside-story" of a memorable and unprecedented exhibition organized in the history of Hong Kong - the "National Treasures: Masterpieces of Chinese Painting and Calligraphy from the Palace Museum" Exhibition. Marco took an important role in this exhibition for he was responsible for the safety of 32 masterpieces in Chinese art history, including the reputable Riverside Scenery at the Qingming Festival (清明上河圖) of the Northern Song dynasty.






Guided tour to the Picasso Exhibition



British Council HK 60th Anniversary Celebration



On 27 September 2008, we had great pleasure to meet with Marco, Virginia and Eileen, three Warwick graduates of Art Education in the 1980s, at the Hong Kong Museum of Art and chat with them on their life at Warwick, career, art and education.


Studying at Warwick widened their vision on art and education, as the course covered a good mix of theories and practical trainings. Eileen and Virginia excitedly told us that they had a ride on an airplane to capture images of the green field for one of their projects while Marco shared with us how he, guided by the professor, went to the Coventry market to learn the visual language from observation. Besides the interesting projects and graduation shows, Marco, who stood out from students from other countries, was also the first Chinese student who had an opportunity to hold his first solo exhibition at the library gallery.

After all the fun and excitement at Warwick, they all came back to develop their career in Hong Kong. Both Eileen and Virginia returned to the teaching field while Marco started his career in the museum. (Marco is now Curator of the Chinese Art section in the Hong Kong Museum of Art) All of them commented on how the Warwick experience had helped in their career. Eileen and Virginia agreed that what they learnt inspired them to use new teaching methods while Macro remarked that the Chinese art exhibitions he now curates carry the concept of western art theories.



Steve Jobs of Apple delivered a fantastic speech at Standford in 2005. His parting words were "Stay hungry, Stay foolish". If you want to succeed, you have to keep your engine steering. This is always my conviction.

Last year, I left the promising full time employment to study again. My friends said that I was taking a gamble. But to me, it's an investment, a long term but rewarding investment. To succeed, you should have the appetite of learning new knowledge. MBA not only provides me with a springboard to lucrative career but also is an amazing learning curve. I have done so many new things in such a short space of time, and met some amazing people. At Warwick, it is not that difficult for you to find students once were top management of the global leading firms. They are confident but not cocky, showcasing their skills and sharing valuable experiences with you. It gives me an opportunity to cram many experiences into a short time.

WGAHK Gifted Youth Award 2008

The IGGY Summer U 2008* course fee was GBP800.

At the application stage, the University of Warwick announced that 2 full bursaries for Hong Kong were available for financially disadvantaged students.

In support of the University's initiatives in gifted education, and also the notion that learning opportunities for talented students should not be limited by one's financial status, WGAHK launched a special award to help students cover primarily their travel cost to the UK for the IGGY Summer U 2008:

A maximum of 2 awards (worth HK\$10,000 each) are available for application. The award is given on the basis of need. It is open to students who are permanent resident of Hong Kong, and who have successfully completed the Warwick IGGY Summer U 2008 programme with a full international bursary granted by the University of Warwick.

The decision to provide the gifted youth award, out of the WGAHK Scholarship Fund, was made by the WGAHK Executive Committee after seeking input from the scholarship fund major donors.

The following 2 Hong Kong students have attended the IGGY Summer U 2008 having awarded the university international bursary and the WGAHK Gifted Youth Award 2008:


Jaime Chiu (Ying Wa Girls' School) - Course attended: Medical Sciences


